We have the first international Norio Suzuki's Requiem Concert at St. Stephen's Cathedral in October 2019. Yoko Sato is the soprano soloist in the concert. Yoko and her sister, Hiroko Sato, are performing many concerts and activities as "Sugar Sisters" to make Japanese songs worldwide. They have a concert in Vienna and the details are as follows.

Yoko and Hiroko were born in Yamagata. They graduated from Tokyo University of the Arts in the faculty of Vocal Music and finished their masters in solo performance. Both of the sisters won first prize in singing Japanese songs competitions. They achieve a great reputation for their beautiful voice and harmony.

Sugar Sisters had their first international concert in Myanmar in 2017. After the concert, they are now doing concerts and activities overseas to make Japanese songs worldwide. They are performing with many orchestras and appearing as guests on TV and radio shows. They also released an album "Megumi" in September 2017 from King Records.

Yoko Sato (Soprano)

completed her Ph.D. in studying Ikuma Dan's songs at Tokyo University of the Arts.

won a second prize at the 17th Sogakudo Japanese Vocal Competition.

won a prize at the 75th Music Competition of Japan and got a Kinoshita prize (a prize for the best Japanese songs' vocalists).

performed at the Japan-China Summit dinner party in 2008.

won a Mitsubishi Estate prize in 2010.

Hiroko Sato (Mezzo-soprano)

won a first prize at the national high school students' competition of the 54th Student Music concours of Japan. sang Japanese national anthem Kimigayo solo at the opening ceremony of the 73rd All-Japan Senior High School Baseball Championship Tournament.

won a first prize at the 20th Sogakudo Japanese Vocal Competition in 2009 and got a Yoshinao Nakada prize.
