#### What is 藝展 ~GEI-TEN~?

GEI-TEN is the name of a unique exhibition project inspired by the specificity of the Japanese language. The Japanese language has three types of script. One of these, the kanji script, contains multiple meanings within a single character, each of which can be read (pronounced) in different ways. We believe that this inclusion of several meanings in a single character embodies the richness and diversity of Japanese sensibility.

Further, the purpose of this exhibition is broadly reflected in the kanji characters that appear in the name of the exhibition.

The character 藝 (*GEI*) means not only "art" but also "plant" and "cultivate," while 展 (*TEN*) means not only "exhibition" but also "advancement." Although showcasing Japanese art is the main purpose of this exhibition, the kanji characters for GEI-TEN also express hopes of "planting" new seeds of friendship between the exhibiting countries and "advancing" them.

The works exhibited at the GEI-TEN span diverse genres. The exhibition aims to promote cultural exchanges between the countries by allowing viewers to experience the Japanese spirit through the thoughts of the artists and their deep spirituality expressed through various forms of artwork.






